I was born in Cyprus, lived in England for 8 years and in New York for 8 years.


In April 1998 while living in New York, I came to faith in Jesus and was born again.

This focus and a repetition phase while learning to read can be at times quite tedious and mechanical; however, it's essential to our process as it cultivates our mind and prepares it to acquire new concepts.

We're going to have conversations in Hebrew. We're going to read scripture, pray and sing worship songs in Hebrew.

I can guarantee that you're going to learn Hebrew, if you persevere.

Your knowledge of Hebrew will open up whole new levels of depth and understanding and blessing in your reading of scripture.

Some interesting historical facts to consider as we set off.

- 1. All the authors of the New Testament were Hebrew, Jewish Israelis. (There are questions about Mark; however, many believe that he was in fact Jewish)
- 2. The meanings of the names and places in the New Testament cannot be understood without a knowledge of Hebrew. Here are some examples:
- Jesus/Yeshua means salvation.
- Bethlehem/Beit Lekhem means the house of bread.
- Capernaum/Kfar Nakhum means the village of comfort.

The Greek and all subsequent translations do not convey these meanings.

- 3. The Septuagint is the Greek translation of the Hebrew Bible.
- The Torah, the five Books of Moses, was translated into Greek by 70 Jewish scholars in the 3rd century BC mainly for the Jewish community in Alexandria, Egypt. Subsequently, the rest of the Hebrew Scriptures were translated into Greek. Greek was the language of commerce in the land during the New Testament period. Aramaic was spoken by the local Inhabitants of Judea and Hebrew was used in the temple and the synagogue.
- 4. The New Testament was claimed by the gentiles just as Yeshua was claimed by the gentiles—especially by the Greek Orthodox Church. Many people in the Greek speaking world are actually of the opinion that the apostles were Greek.
- Since the Roman Emperor Constantine adopted "Christianity" to be the religion of the empire with the Edict of Milan in A.D. 313, the faith was intentionally distanced and detached from its Hebrew, Jewish, Israeli roots.
- Even though the Hebrew Scriptures, including the New Testament writings of the apostles, were the official and accepted canonical text of the faith, all connection to Israel was erased. So called Hebraisers, believers who made the Hebrew, Jewish, Israeli connection, were even punished by death.

- Sunday was adopted over Shabbat, Saturday. Pagan holidays were adopted over the Biblical, Jewish holidays. Maximus Pontificus, the high priest of Rome, became the Pope whom the Catholic religion calls Christ on earth.
- Consequently, the study of Hebrew was prohibited and the study of Greek was advanced.
- Jerusalem was replaced by Rome and was named the eternal city.
- The pope, instead of Christ became the Chief Corner Stone upon which the church is being built.
- The teachings and doctrines of Athenian philosophers like Plato and Socrates became highly influential in the evolution of the Christian faith and in many cases overshadowed the teachings of the Apostles and the Prophets who are the foundation of our faith, Messiah Himself being the Chief Corner Stone.
